# **Briarwood Banks**

#### Access/entrances:

Several public footpaths cross the reserve, although there are three main entry points. From Plankey Mill (OL43 796622) a wide footbridge crosses the River Allen and enters the reserve. Access to the bridge involves 7 steps on the east and a descent of 12 steps on the west. Entering the reserve, a steep climb leads to a second, narrower footbridge over the Briarwood Burn.

The northern entrance to the reserve can be accessed by following a wide, well-surfaced riverside path from the National Trust car park (pay & display) at Allen Banks. After a swing bridge over the River Allen is passed, the path can become muddy, uneven and steep in places with a variable width.

Finally, a footpath enters the reserve from the south via Kingswood Farm (OL43 790611). On leaving the farm the right of way is not well defined, and crosses often-boggy meadows.

### Terrain:

The grassland at the northern end of the reserve is flat and easily negotiated via a grass path - however, it is not easy to access this area. The remainder of the reserve offers a challenging terrain with steep slopes and very narrow paths.

#### Paths:

Several paths cross the reserve – all are narrow, often muddy and can be difficult to negotiate.

## Facilities:

The National Trust car park at Allen Banks has toilets and a picnic area.
