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People taking action for wildlife

East Chevington

Access/entrances:

The main access is from a minor road which leaves the coastal route opposite the Red Row junction. 1km along this road, a 'pull-in' on the right gives access to a viewing platform over the southern fields and pond, and to one of the wildlife hides. Opposite the 'pull-in', a wide gap gives access to a well-surfaced footpath leading to another hide. Further along the road, a larger 'pull-in' gives access to the coastal paths from which the other hides can be reached, via a well-surfaced path with a wide bridge.

From Druridge Bay Country Park, to the north of the reserve, there is pay & display parking and access to the coastal path and via woodland walks to the footpath leading to one of the hides. The woodland walk is over a wide, level gravelled path and the coastal path is gained through a wide latch gate.

Terrain:

Terrain is a series of level and well-surfaced footpaths.

Paths:

All footpaths are level, well-surfaced and usually over 100cm wide. There is a wide section of boardwalk outside one of the hides, leading to a wider viewing platform over a pond.

Facilities:

There are toilets and a café at the Druridge Bay Country Park. There are five wildlife hides on the reserve and several viewing areas with benches: all are accessed by well-surfaced paths and offer good views over the pond.
